Off Road Adventure Awaits

The Bearlodge district of the Black Hills covers over 130,000 acres and has some very diverse ATV trails and forest roads. There are two off-road trailheads in the Bearlodge: Blacktail Creek Trailhead near Hulett and the Reuter Campground Trailhead near Sundance. The trails cover high ridges and low valleys with an abundance of wild-life including elk, deer, and antelope. There are forest roads to challenge any rider. There are two improved campgrounds and rough camping throughout the forest.

ORV permit stickers are available at the Rapid Stop Conoco at Hwy 90 exit 185 for \$25. Trail Maps are available at the forest Service office on 21st Street and Cleveland in Sundance.

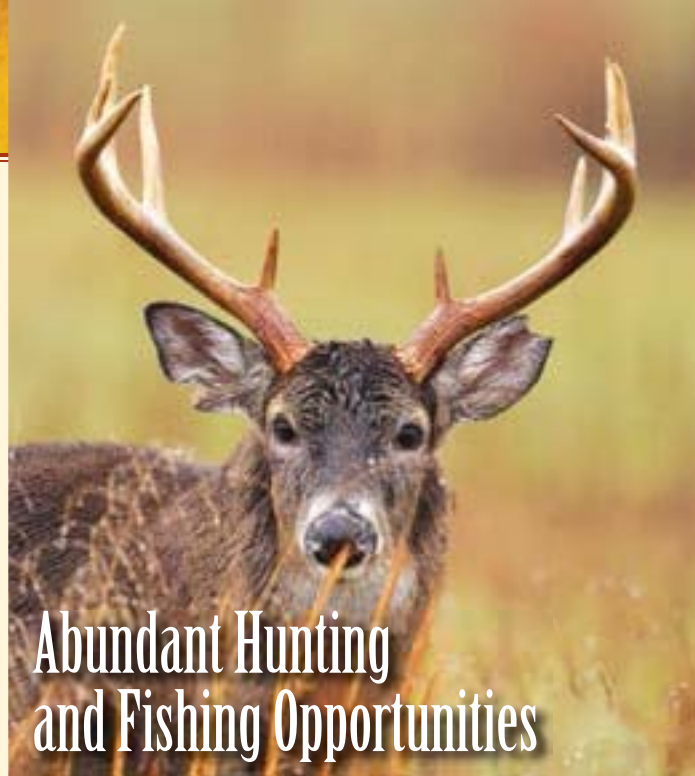

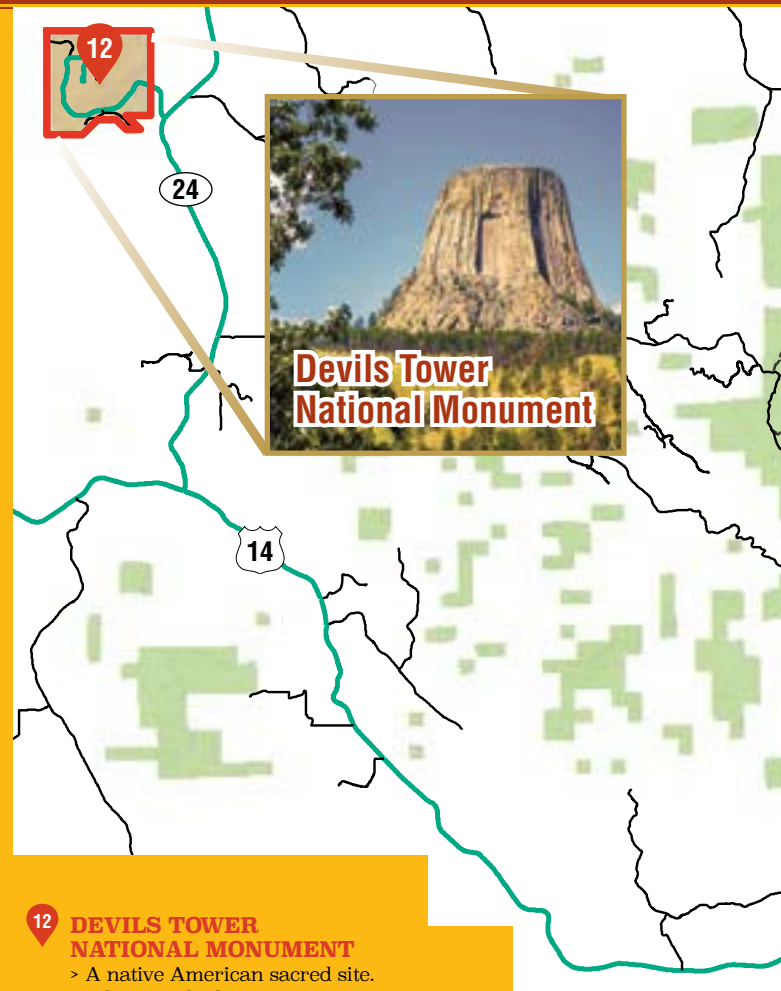

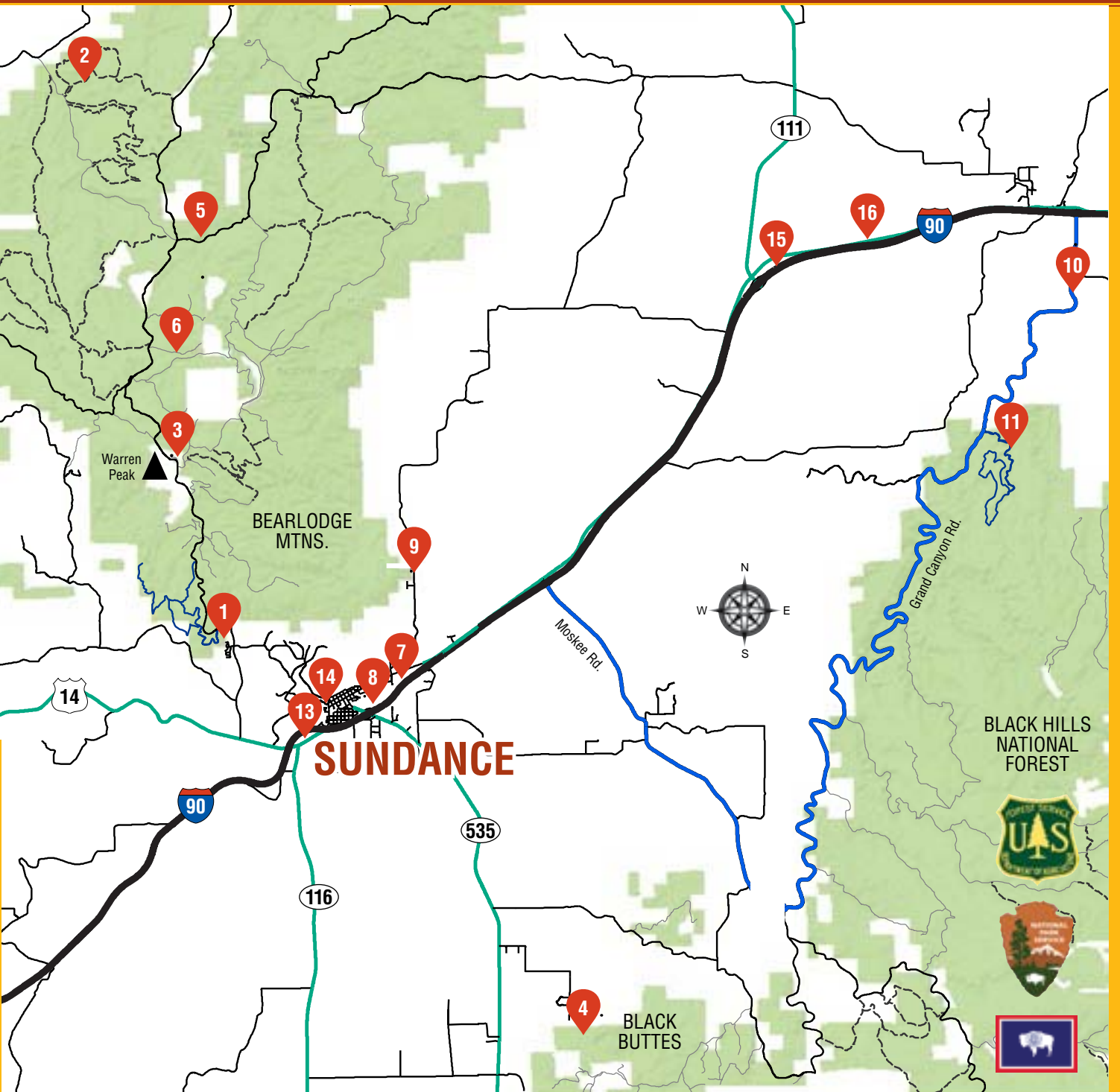

- 1 RUETER CAMPGROUND / TRAILHEAD,**
> Campground has primitive campsites with pit toilets and water available. Trailhead for Carson Draw trail system in the southern Bearlodge Mountains, biking, hiking, horseback, cross country skiing. Also trailhead for ORV or snowmachine trails throughout the Bearlodge Mountains.
- 2 BLACKTAIL CREEK TRAILHEAD**
> Trailhead offering access to the northern Bearlodge Mountains. ATV, ORV and snowmachine trails.
- 3 WARREN PEAK LOOKOUT TOWER**
> FREE attraction. 6,650 ft. elevation. Active fire lookout for the northern hills, once was the first nuclear powered radar station in the country. Climb the tower for a great view of the area and beautiful sunsets.
- 4 BLACK BUTTES / FISH CANYON REC AREA**
> Trailhead on Canyon Springs Road for hiking, biking, snowshoeing and fat tire biking in the winter. Non-motorized.
- 5 COOK LAKE CAMPGROUND / SWALLOW TAIL HIKING TRAIL**
> Primitive campsites with pit toilets and water available. Cook Lake is stocked with trout. Hiking, biking and kayaking.
- 6 RUETERS GRAVE**
> Gravesite of an early settler / prospector who settled in the Bearlodge Mountains. One of Rueters mines can be seen just further up the trail.
- 7 FOREST SERVICE OFFICE**
> Information for Bearlodge Mountains including ATV Maps, and hunting information.
- 8 SUNDANCE POND**
> Pond is stocked with trout. Hiking, kayaking, and picnicking.
- 9 SUNDANCE HORSE CAMP TRAILHEAD**
> Primitive campsites with horse corrals. Trailhead for several different trails into the southern Bearlodge Mountains. Hiking, biking, and horseback.
- 10 SAND CREEK REC AREA**
> Several fishing access areas along Sand Creek, class 1 trout stream. Primitive campsites with pit toilets. Hiking, biking and float tubing.
- 11 DUGOUT GULCH BOTANICAL TRAIL**
> Hiking, horseback riding, bicycling and cross-country skiing. No motorized vehicles allowed.



- 12 DEVILS TOWER NATIONAL MONUMENT**
> A native American sacred site. Hiking & climbing.
- 13 RAPID STOP CONOCO GAS STATION**
> ORV Permits.
- 14 BLACK IRON GUNS**
> Hunting, fishing licenses and guns.
- 15 WYOMING VISITOR CENTER**
> Learn more about Wyoming with local, expert advice from the staff. Maps, brochures and other resources available.
- 16 VORE BUFFALO JUMP**
> Natural sinkhole used by Plains Indians as a trap for bison. Premier archaeological site with historical, scientific & educational exhibits.

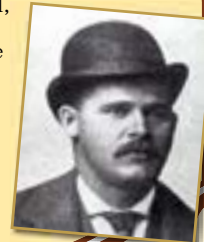

MONTANA SILVERSMITHS

The Sundance Kid

One February morning in 1887, a young fella named Harry Longabaugh, later known as The Sundance Kid, was walking from the Black Hills to Montana to look for ranch work. Just north of Sundance he spotted a ranch hand who had left his horse unattended. The horse was set with a saddle and guns. Well, it was snowing and cold so Harry decided he needed that horse more than the ranch hand, so he jump on it and took off. Wasn't long before Sheriff Ryan of Crook County caught up with Harry in Montana.

The first attempt to bring Harry to justice was unsuccessful. The second time the sheriff caught up with Harry, he spent 18 long months in the Crook County jail in Sundance. After Harry was released from jail, he became known as The Sundance Kid and joined up with Butch Cassidy and the Hole in the Wall Gang. They started the longest crime spree in American outlaw history. They robbed banks from Canada to South America but never were seen in Sundance again.

Climbing Devils Tower

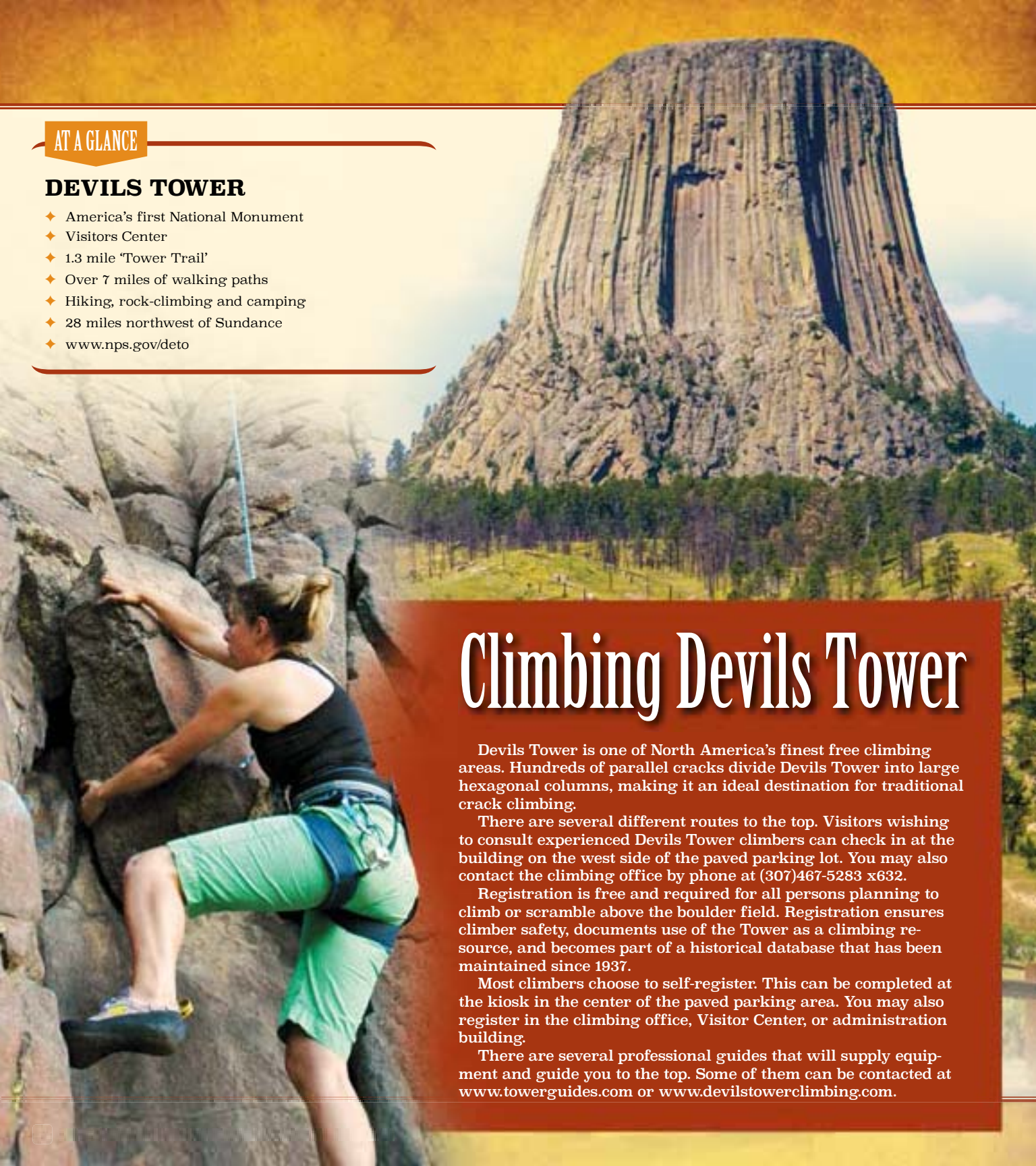
Devils Tower is one of North America's finest free climbing areas. Hundreds of parallel cracks divide Devils Tower into large hexagonal columns, making it an ideal destination for traditional crack climbing.

There are several different routes to the top. Visitors wishing to consult experienced Devils Tower climbers can check in at the building on the west side of the paved parking lot. You may also contact the climbing office by phone at (307)467-5283 x632.

Registration is free and required for all persons planning to climb or scramble above the boulder field. Registration ensures climber safety, documents use of the Tower as a climbing resource, and becomes part of a historical database that has been maintained since 1937.

Most climbers choose to self-register. This can be completed at the kiosk in the center of the paved parking area. You may also register in the climbing office, Visitor Center, or administration building.

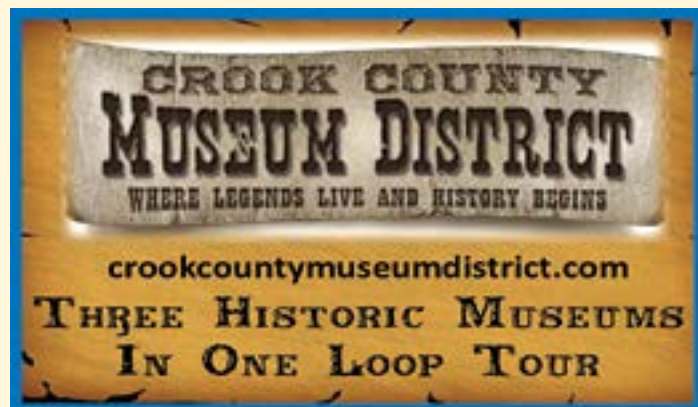
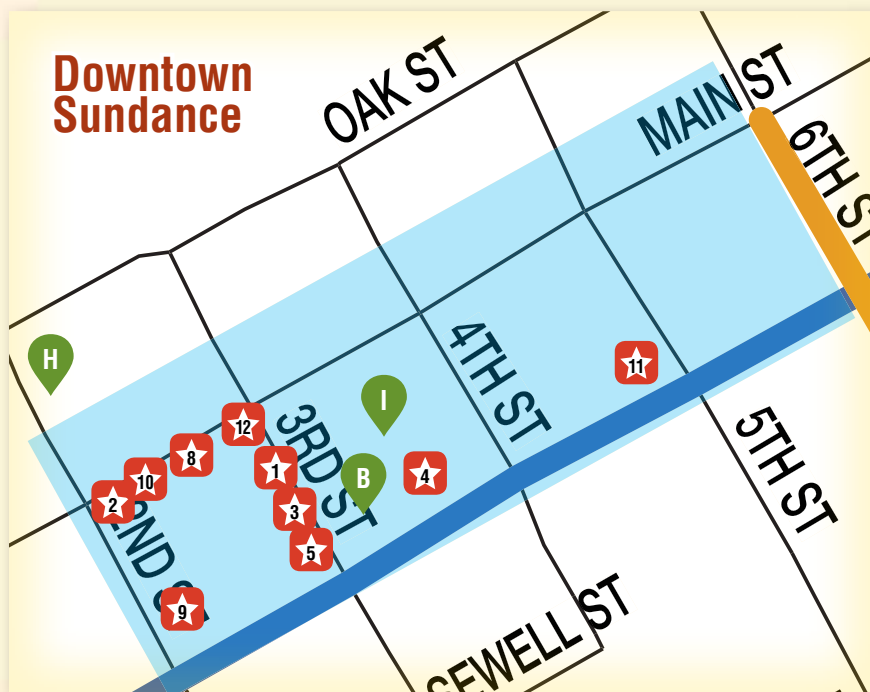

Northern Hills

The route goes from about 1 mile east of Aladdin along Hwy 24 to Devils Tower and includes a walking portion around Devils Tower.

The tour takes visitors past the Aladdin Tipple, where coal was loaded on trains or trucks to be shipped east, then through Aladdin's 110 year old trading post. Along the Belle Fourche river, learn about the history of Hulettes and into Devils Tower. The walking portion follows the paved path around the Devils tower. The original court room where the Sundance Kid had his trial is on display in one of our permanent exhibits along with a gun exhibit that is phenomenal.

Go on an adventure of a lifetime with Custer and his men as they trek through the Black Hills in the Expedition of 1874. Follow the trails and the tribulations of his men as they fight for survival against nature, the illicit miners, and the natives.

Explore Moses Annenberg's great hide-away locally know as Ranch A. When he was looking for a quiet place to relax and a place to throw some great parties for his fellow city dudes he would come to the isolation of the Black Hills and go to his local canyon ranch to kick up his heels.

The 1875 Gallery has the best regional art for sale from bronze sculpture, colored pencil, water color, photography, collage, hand formed jewelry, pottery, and oils. The 1875 gallery has art from wildlife, still lifes, interpretive, conceptual, and functional.

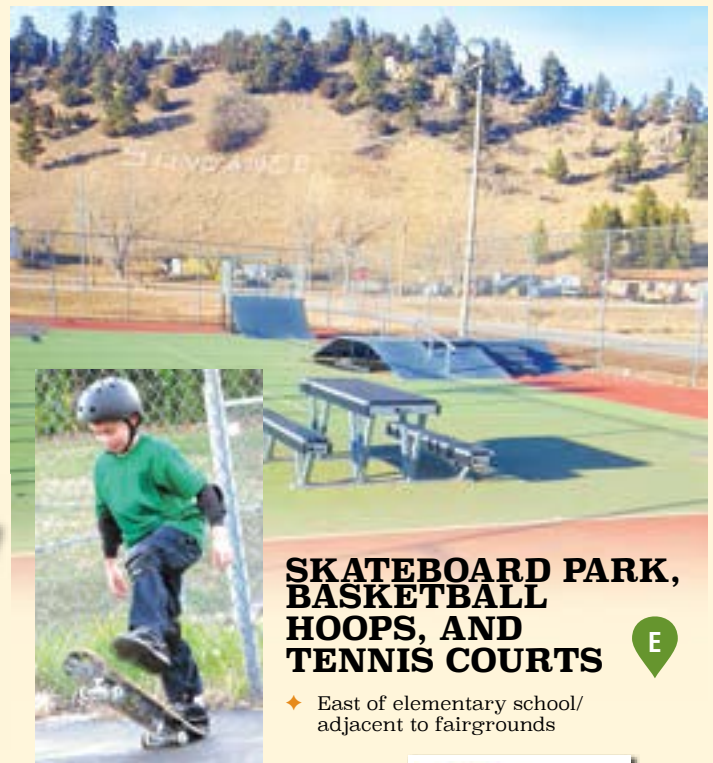

Jump into history at the Vore Buffalo Jump

Open annually from June 1 thru Labor day, the Vore Buffalo Jump provides a unique insight into over 250 years of Native American history.

The Vore Buffalo Jump features enormous quantities of bone and stone artifacts that are perfectly preserved in discrete, precisely datable layers and held in place within a natural bowl.

Within the site are the butchered remnants of more than 4,000 bison as well as thousands of chipped stone arrow points, knives, and other tools. The materials are contained within 22 cultural levels that extend downward to a depth of nearly 25 feet.

Because only about 10% of the Vore Buffalo Jump has been excavated, there is potential for decades of scientific research in several different disciplines... archaeology, tribal ethnohistory, zoology, geology, and paleoclimatic studies. Dozens of technical papers based on data from the Vore site have already been published. Just as the Black Hills attracted Native Americans, visitors from around the world are fascinated by Plains Indians. Because it is literally a stone's throw from one of America's busiest highways, the Vore Buffalo Jump is also one of the most accessible of the major Plains Indian archaeological sites to the traveling public.

Until the late 1700s the only beasts of burden used by the Plains Indian tribes were dogs. Dogs, the first domesticated

animals in North America, were used for hunting, hauling, transporting, guarding campsites and as a food source. Breeding dogs with wolves was common. Five canid skulls have been found at the Vore Site. These skulls provide evidence that the Native Americans broke off or filed down the canine teeth of their dogs.... presumably to prevent the dogs from injuring their owners or other dogs and to prevent them from chewing through their tethers. An exhibit at the Vore Site features one of these skulls.

Tours of the Vore Site are guided by trained interpretive staff. Exhibits focus on how Native American hunters "jumped" bison, the tribes who likely used the sinkhole as a bison trap, how meat and hides were used, and the artifacts left behind by the hunters. Families are welcome; a number of exhibits are geared to children.

The real Story of Potato Creek Johnny

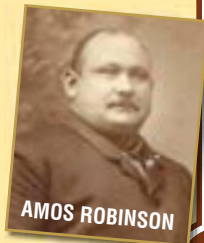

Meet Amos Robinson

Amos Robinson was a businessman who opened up the Wyoming Mercantile in Aladdin. In 1896, Amos Robinson opened a saloon in Beulah, where Ed Ross was already running a successful saloon.

Robinson was enjoying a game of High Five when Ross came in a sat next to him and started to count his score Robinson remarked "Mr. Ross we are having a sociable game and I propose to the counting myself you have no right to interfere, at this instant Ross took Robinson by the ear and gave it a twist at the same time slapping him in the face, remarking "you think I can't count, you d—n son of a b—h.

Nothing was said after that and at the end of the night Robinson offered drinks. After closing up Robinson was outside of his establishment and a confrontation started between the two, shots where fired, Robinson went to the neighbors porch and told him "I think I'm done for". Ross told them to get the sheriff and said that he "Shot the belly off old fatty Robinson". Ross was sentenced for life and then was paroled 8 years and 3 months later.
